### APPROVAL OF MINUTES and FINANCIAL REPORT:

## **NEW BUSINESS:**

A motion was made by Zackary Salyer, and seconded by Teresa Tilson to begin collecting bids for the repair and repaving of the drainage problem and pot hole located on Maple Street and Sugarwood, Weber City, which is to be covered by ARPA funds due to erosion.

### Public Presentations:

The floor was then opened up for Public comment and/or questions.

Citizen, Sherry Tate, made comments regarding the parking issue on Johnson Street. She owns property there, and has observed cars parking in the street, beside the street, etc. blocking the street most of the time, to the point that other residents cannot use it. She has contacted WCPD, Scott County Sheriffs Department, and ultimately the State Police numerous times to have the street cleared of traffic. She is requesting that "NO PARKING" signs be added to Johnson Street, as well as signs restricting the speed limit in that area to 25 mph due to its residential nature. It was discussed, by the Council, that that street is owned and maintained by VDOT, and a request will be made for such signage, by our Street Committee.

She also mentioned concern for the kind of traffic that is frequently using that area day and night for suspicious activity, and requested that it be looked into. A majority of the cars that park there have Tennessee tags. She asked if a Noise Ordinance was in effect for within the Weber City Town limits, and if yes, asked that it be enforced due to the activities currently going on in that area of town.

Citizen, Tim Cox, of 269 Tulip Poplar Street, Weber City, expressed concern for an abandoned property on Tulip Poplar Street. The house is reportedly owned by a dentist in Big Stone Gap. The house is not maintained properly by its owners. It is vacant and draws concern that it is falling into disrepair, and unkempt appearance. He requested that letters be sent to this land owner, as well as others in town, that have allowed their properties to become overgrown, trashed, and becoming a hazard.

Being no further Public Comment, Vice Mayor Justin Addington, closed the floor for Public Comment.

#### Legal Affairs – by Attorney Mike Carrico

Items will be covered in Closed Session. Mike reported that he is researching who owns the old Scott County Lumber Company building, so that letters can be sent to them requiring them to clean up their property.

## Committee Reports:

### ARPA Committee Report:

No new developments to report.

### Finance Committee Report:

Council Members, Greg Smith and Teresa Tilson, had no new items to report. They requested that any monthly services that the Town uses, have bids or proposals for better prices, be submitted to the Budget Committee for consideration for the Budget FY2023-24, to please submit that information ASAP since they would be working on the Budget soon.

### Maintenance Committee Report:

Derek Pearcy updated that no bids have been received yet regarding the new Heating/Cooling units for the WCFD located on Roland Street. Also looking into some prices for plumbing and insulation repairs at the same location.

#### Planning Committee Report:

### Street Committee Report:

Derek Pearcy, Committee Member, gave a report regarding a large pot hole on Maple Street (a Town owned road) that will require repair along with drain repair. A motion was made regarding this, and is recorded in the "New Business" section of these minutes.

#### Police Department Report:

Chief Donald Harding, III, presented the Council with a brief summary of recent Police Department events, and call logs. He shared with the Council information regarding the process they are doing currently for selecting the new hires for the Department. Each candidate has been vetted appropriately, and he is pleased with the results. He also updated the Council on new and current grants available from Federal and Local governments that the Department will be applying for in the near future to bring equipment and resources up to date. He also informed the Council of the difficulty in finding Architectural firms that are willing to submit a bid for the design of the Police Department renovation.

#### Fire Department Report:

Matt Ison, gave the report for the WCFD. He informed the Council that he has spoken with Freda Starnes from the Scott County Administrator's Office, who gave the WCFD permission to use the surplus funds (\$9,801.41) from the equipment purchase of February 2021. The Fire Department will collect receipts or new qualifying equipment quotes up to this amount, and present them to the Town for payment.
